Veolia Transportation Wins Downtown DASH In Los Angeles -Initial Contract is Three Years with Two One-Year Options-

Chicago, IL – Veolia Transportation President and COO, Mike Griffus, announced this week the award of the "Downtown DASH" contract in Los Angeles, California.

The Downtown DASH contract serves the Los Angeles Department of Transportation. The contract includes eight routes in and around downtown Los Angeles utilizing 63 buses. The initial term is three years, with two option years.

Veolia Transportation assumes responsibility for operations on March 1, 2009. The company will work with First Transit, the system's operator for the past ten years, to ensure a smooth transition. Veolia Transportation's base of operations for this contract will be located in downtown's Chinatown; the heart of the service area.

Traffic congestion is a serious issue in the downtown area, as are on-time performance and the "bunching" of buses. Veolia Transportation has a multi-part strategy for dealing with these issues, including updated technology, rigorous driver training and improved operational coordination to enhance customer service.

Veolia Transportation Regional Vice-President, Francois Regembal, said, "This important contract further consolidates our presence in the Los Angeles area. We thank the City of Los Angeles for their business and their trust in Veolia's ability to improve the service delivery on this project."

Veolia Transportation currently operates two of the seven DASH segments in Los Angeles managed by the LA Dot; the LA DASH 3 in the San Fernando Valley and the LA DASH 5-A in Southeast Los Angeles.
